Missouri was the 24th state in the USA; it became a state on August 10, 1821.

State Abbreviation - MO

State Capital - Jefferson City

Largest City - Kansas City

Area - 69,709 square miles

[Missouri is the 21st biggest state in the USA]

Population - 5,988,927 (as of 2010)

[Missouri is the 18th most populous state in the USA]

Name for Residents - Missourians

Major Industries - Farming (corn, soybeans), mining (zinc, lead), aircraft equipment, cars, beer.



Presidential Birthplace - Harry S. Truman was born in Lamar (near Joplin) on May 8, 1884 (he was the 33rd US President, serving from 1945 to 1953).

Major Rivers - Mississippi River, Missouri River, Osage River
Major Lakes - Lake of the Ozarks, Table Rock Lake, Clearwater Lake, Lake Wappapello

Highest Point - Taum Sauk Mountain- 1,772 feet (540 m) above sea level

Bordering States - Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Tennessee

Origin of the Name Missouri - Missouri was named for an Algonquian Indian word that means "river of the big canoes."

OTHER ACTIVITIES AND ATTRACTIONS AROUND ST. LOUIS

The following list features attractions within walking distance or on the Metrolink routes that can be done at your convenience:

The Gateway Arch and Jefferson National Expansion Memorial Park: Take a ride to the top and see the movie that explains the nation's tallest monument for a fee. The great Westward Expansion Museum is in the base and is open free of charge!

The Old Courthouse: St. Louis' first administrative building and the site of famous trials like the Dred Scott Slave case and women's right to vote case. Restored courtrooms, films, dioramas and more await inside. Open daily 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Free of charge.

The Old Cathedral: The Basilica of St. Louis, King of France, under the arch, was the first Catholic Church west of the Mississippi and is still an active parish! A museum in the basement of the church highlights the history of the city. Church is open daily 6:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The church has regular Mass Schedules. This is a popular wedding venue so keep an eye out for bridal parties!

Kiener Plaza and City Garden: Sitting in the heart of downtown St. Louis, Kiener Plaza and the Morton D. May Amphitheater command a dramatic view of the Old Court House and the Gateway Arch. The park's centerpiece is a pool and fountain containing a statue known as "The Runner" by sculptor William Zorach. City Garden is a beautiful green space park in downtown between 8th and 10th streets near Chestnut. It is free and has the same hours as all other city parks. Water is one of the most expressive elements at City Garden. Three fountains are interspersed throughout the park, combining with sculpture and lush plant life to create a unique visitor experience. The Terrace View Café offers reasonable lunch and dinner in the park setting.
