Why does an alarm clock "go off" when it begins ringing?



### More History Questions & Answers

It took me a long time to provide this answer, but I learned a lot!

#### Q. Have the Landmarks changed?

A. Grammatical changes have been made to the Landmarks since their inception in 1920, but no substantive changes have been made. First Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Supreme Guardian Council (SGC), pg. 5, reads: "The land marks of the organization were laid at this time [October 20, 1920] and it was decided to organize." The Landmarks appear on pg. 65 of the Proceedings of the Third Annual Meeting of the SGC held October 1923. Grammatical changes appear in subsequent printings of the SGC Proceedings and the Constitution and Bylaws: 15<sup>th</sup> verse of the 42<sup>nd</sup> chapter became 42<sup>nd</sup> chapter, 15<sup>th</sup> verse; 'laws' became 'bylaws'; 'openbook' became 'open book' and then 'Open Book'.


