Masonic Temple Tour with Mitch Albom experience and Detroit River Walk **\$60.00** **9am-3pm**

The cost includes transportation to the Masonic Temple Tour, and a voucher for the Detroit Water Ice Factory. Lunch will be on your own with plenty of neighborhood options to choose from.

- ❖ **Detroit Masonic Temple** – The Detroit Masonic Temple is the largest building of its kind in the world! Ironically the architectural firm “George Mason and Company, and ground was broken on Thanksgiving Day in 1920. The formal dedication took place on Thanksgiving Day in 1926, with thousands of Detroiters present for the ceremony. The unique design included 3 theaters, a Shrine building, a chapel, 8 lodge rooms, a drill hall, 2 ballrooms, office space, a barber shop, 16 bowling lanes, a cafeteria, dining rooms, and much much more. The original design included 1037 rooms in total, in addition to a powerhouse that generated all the electricity for the complex. This guided tour is a must-see for everyone in the Masonic Family!

- ❖ **Detroit Water Ice** - Created by SAY Detroit founder Mitch Albom, the Detroit Water Ice Factory is a dessert store in downtown Detroit, owned entirely by SAY Detroit, with 100% of the profits going to help Detroiters in need. The store follows the “Newman’s Own” model of philanthropy, offering delicious frozen dessert, gourmet popcorn, and other products with the sole goal of raising funds to help others. Water ice is a smoother version of Italian ice with tons of flavor but no fat, dairy, or gluten (with a few exceptions).

- ❖ **River Walk** – self-guided. Along its 3.5-mile route, the River Walk offers breathtaking views of the Detroit River and city skyline. Recreational opportunities abound as the trail links Milliken State Park and numerous plazas and pocket parks. The 31-acre state park offers covered picnic areas, shoreline fishing, and a great photo opportunity with its 63-foot-tall lighthouse. On its western end, the Renaissance Center—a cluster of seven interconnected skyscrapers, including the General Motors world headquarters—offers shopping, dining, lodging, and entertainment. A block from the Renaissance Center, in Rivard Plaza, the beautiful, custom-made Cullen Family Carousel features animals all native to the Detroit River, except two: a sea serpent and a mermaid.
