


LETTERS OF INTENT

If you are registered as a voting delegate for Session, stay tuned for more information regarding the voting process & town hall registration.




DAUGHTER VOTING DELEGATES

What makes a great marketing photo?

Portrait-style group shots with smiling faces are perfect. Think clear, well-lit photos with everyone looking at the camera (or naturally interacting), minimal background distractions, and members in regalia or Bethel shirts when possible.

⊘ Avoid: Distant crowd shots, photos with cluttered backgrounds, or blurry images

If you see a moment that screams "this is what JDI is all about," don't be afraid to ask for consent and recreate it, then snap the photo.

When submitting images and videos, please include:

- Bethel Number and Location
- A short caption or description about the image
- Photographer's name
- Confirmation that all Daughters in the photo have given consent and have a current media release on file

YOUTH PROTECTION PROGRAM UPDATES

During the last couple of years, there have been a few updates/revisions to our YPP Policy and we want to make sure everyone is aware of them. In case you have not heard...

- New CAV's in the U.S. and Canada must complete a two-hour on-line Mandated Reporter Training for volunteers. This also applies to those who are re-taking the CAV class due to a lapsed CAV.
- A Majority Member who is not a CAV may serve as a protem officer (not the presiding officer) during a meeting at which the Membership or Majority Ceremony is being held.
- Any adult may play an instrument during a meeting or open ceremony without being a CAV. These non-CAV adults playing the instrument are not part of the BGC and must direct all relevant questions to the BGC. All adults serving as an installed BGC member must still be a current CAV (including those filling in for one of those positions).
- A Daughter serving as an officer at the Bethel, Jurisdictional or International level who is 19 years of age at the time of installation or crowning may complete the term without being a CAV even if she turns 20 during the term. She will also qualify to serve as a protem at any JDI level until her term is finished without requiring a CAV.

There was also a major change in the Drug and Alcohol policy. Below is the entire policy for your reference.

Drugs and Alcohol

JDI expects that CAVs exhibit the highest behavioral integrity, model healthy behaviors, and not engage in any behavior that could cause harm, or be misinterpreted as possibly causing harm, to Daughters by adhering to the following policy on alcohol and drugs. The consumption of alcohol, cannabis, illegal drugs (as defined by Federal law), or other intoxicants or the abuse of over-the-counter, prescription drugs, or any other substance for non-medicinal purposes, which impair performance or judgment, shall be strictly prohibited as follows:

1. For ALL CAVs, prior to and while attending a meeting, whether virtually or in person. Meetings include all local, jurisdictional, and international business meetings, installations, and pageants;
2. While serving as a designated chaperone;
3. For CAVs responsible for, in-charge of, or presiding during JDI events/activities, with Daughters present, shall adhere to the above consumption policy during and prior to said event or activity.

USING THE JOBS DAUGHTERS INTERNATIONAL TRADE MARKS

It is about now that Vice Guardians at all levels are making plans for their terms in the top jobs and thinking about term polo shirts, logos and other bits and pieces personalized to their term theme.

To ensure that you are compliant with the Board of Trustees' Policy on Trademark usage, visit the International web site and check out the requirements and the policy can be found under RESOURCES/BRAND GUIDELINES/TRADEMARK. If after reading the policy you have any questions, **DO NOT HESITATE** to send me an email outlining your questions or queries.

Basically, there are 2 groups of TRADEMARKS:

Registered TRADEMARKS which covers the triangle logos and the words "Jobs Daughters International" both in English and Portuguese. To use these, approval is required and may or may not involve payment of a fee; or

Other TRADEMARKS which are a group of names and initials which have protected usage but are able to be used without seeking approval.

If using any of the Registered TRADE MARKS, it is important that they be used in the correct format to be compliant.

The other important part of the usage Policy relates to online selling, advertising, marketing or listing.... This is **NOT ALLOWED** without first obtaining approval of the Board of Trustees.




